Availability: Flexible, dependent upon availability of volunteers for the rota **Frequency:** Weekly rota established in advance, volunteers to input times

Outline of Role:

Community Partnership empowers people to support those around them at the end of life. As a volunteer, your role will be to sit in vigil with individuals who have no kin, relatives, or friends during their final days, making yourself available at preferred times to ensure they do not die alone.

Your presence will foster community cohesion and comfort relatives knowing their loved ones were not alone. You will be a comforting presence, interacting with next of kin, relatives, and friends as needed.

Role tasks:

- Joining 2 WhatsApp groups 'NODA Information' and 'NODA Rota' and adhering to the ground rules of both.
- Attending a NODA Orientation session and ongoing NODA 'circles' for informal support.
- Infilling your weekly availability to sit in vigil at St. Michael's Hospice, local care homes or in people's homes.
- Attend the agreed location based on requests from the NODA Information group.
- Sit in vigil with people actively dying in their last 3 days of life.
- Informing other NODA members via NODA Information WhatsApp if patient has died.

Skills and Experience Required:

- Good listening skills
- Understanding of confidentiality and an ability to maintain confidentiality and the boundaries of the role
- Empathetic and patient when communicating with family/kin/visitors
- Experience in using digital tools, such as WhatsApp or alternative methods

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Other Requirements:

- Ability to travel to/from community venues including nursing/care homes, people's homes and the Hospice at potentially unsociable hours
- Ability to manage one's own time and to be punctual with handovers to/from other NODA volunteers
- Able to raise concerns with relevant people appropriately
- Ability to work and communicate well in different teams

Personal Qualities Required:

- Being comfortable in the presence of a dying person
- Patience, sensitivity and emotional resilience
- Being mindful and present in the moment
- Understanding of the need to not impose personal views/perspectives/beliefs on others
